I gained dual accreditation in Anaesthesia and Intensive Care Medicine in the UK in 2010 before coming to Australia. I completed over two years of further supervised training, gained Fellowship of the College of Intensive Care Medicine in 2011 and became a Staff Specialist in 2013.

I have special interests in medical education and simulation. I am a Clinical Senior Lecturer at the University of Sydney, have a postgraduate Certificate in Medical Education and extensive teaching and simulation experience. I have set up 'in-situ' simulation training programs in four ICUs in the UK and Australia, including Royal North Shore and North Shore Private Hospitals, and have given several talks on simulation at international conferences. I coordinate the ICU teaching program at Royal North Shore Hospital and founded the RNSH ICU and Simulation Fellowship, for which I am supervisor of training.

I am interested in quality and safety in healthcare. I sat on the Clinical Council at the Clinical Excellence Commission from 2011 to 2014 and am now part of the Intensive Care New South Wales Clinical Best Practice Working Group at the Agency for Clinical Innovation. I led a quality improvement project at RNSH ICU which won national, state and district awards in 2019/20. I am also the medical lead for the RNSH Tracheostomy Team which won a Northern Sydney LHD 2017 Exceptional People Award.

I am the lead Organ Donation Specialist (Medical) at Royal North Shore Hospital, a member of the Organ and Tissue Authority Family Conversation Steering Group and one of ten lead trainers for the national Core Family Donation Conversation Workshop.

I have a keen interest in airway management. I am the ANZCA Airway co-lead at RNSH, co-chair of the RNSH Airway Safety Group, and direct a highly successful airway course. I am also the immediate past President (and now a Director) of the Safe Airway Society of Australia and New Zealand, a not-for-profit organisation which aims to optimise the provision of safe, effective patient care through a collaborative approach across professions.

- A presentation about the Bristol simulation program won first prize at the 2010 Association for Simulated Practice in Healthcare Conference.
- I have also organised and conducted simulation sessions for large numbers of delegates at the Bedside Critical Care Conference (2012 and 2013) and the SMACC Conference (2013 2017).

Core Family Donation Conversation Workshop

CLINICAL AUDIT

In-hospital deaths (2013)

Aim To examine all in-hospital deaths for 6 months looking for missed potential organ donors.

Results Of 427 deaths, 9 discussed as possible missed organ donors, one missed potential donor.

Outcome Further education sessions to reinforce the clinical trigger for potential organ donors.

Emergency tracheal intubation (2010)

Aim To audit current practice during emergency tracheal intubation in ICU, ED and wards.

Results Variation in staff seniority, use of difficult airway equipment, waveform capnography.

Outcome An education package was designed to reinforce safe practice including the routine use of

waveform capnography for all emergency tracheal intubations.

Anticoagulation in patients receiving continuous renal replacement therapy (2009)

Aim To audit adherence to the target APTT ratio for patients receiving heparin for renal

replacement therapy in the ICU.

Results 40% of APTTRs were above the target range, and 7% were over 5.

Outcome Target APTTR range lowered to 1.0-1.4. ICU changed to regional citrate anticoagulation.

End-of-life care documentation on the ICU (2007)

Aim To analyse the quality of documentation of end-of-life decisions and treatment

withdrawal plans for patients dying in the ICU.

Results There was a wide variation in quality with much deviation from guidelines.

Outcome The Liverpool Care of the Dying Pathway adopted. Audit presented at ICU audit meeting.

ICU discharge delay audit (2006)

Aim To audit the duration and cause of discharge delays from Critical Care to the wards.

Results The average delay was 14 hours, compared to the local standard, which is set at 2 hours.

Delays were usually due to delayed discharge of ward patients ('bed-block').

Outcome Outreach team empowered to expedite ward discharges. Audit at regional conference.

Nosocomial infections and their associated risk factors in the Neonatal ICU (2004)

Aim To audit the incidence and associations of hospital-acquired infections in the NICU.

Results Rates of infection were comparable with national averages. A positive correlation with

the duration of use of umbilical lines was identified.

Outcome 2% chlorhexidine and full asepsis adopted for line insertions. Surveillance program

continued. Audit presented at the Paediatric Society of New Zealand Annual Conference

Prescribing audit (2003)

Aim Snapshot audit of prescribing errors on drug charts for three different specialities.

Results High frequency of errors.

Outcome Report circulated to ward managers and junior doctors. Teaching package implemented.

Surveillance program continued.
