Career Overview and Research Achievements

Professor Leanne Togher is a certified practicing speech pathologist and Professor at The University of Sydney with over 30 years' experience in the field of brain injury rehabilitation and senior administration. After completing their PhD in 1998, they were the first allied health professional to be awarded The University of Sydney Postdoctoral Fellowship in 1999 with 2 career interruptions (2000, 2004). After working part time (0.6FTE) from 1999-2007, they were awarded their 1st NHMRC Senior Research Fellowship (2007-2011), followed by a 2nd SRF in 2013 which was extended by one year. Their 3rd consecutive NHMRC SRF commenced in 2018 which was recognised by the Elizabeth Blackburn Award for highest ranked Fellow applicant in Clinical Medicine in 2018. They have been awarded an NHMRC Investigator Grant at the highest level (L3) commencing 2024; the first speech pathologist to be awarded this grant. Commencing as Lecturer (2006), they were promoted to Senior Lecturer (2008), Associate Professor (2010) and Professor in 2012. Togher served as Associate Dean Research, Faculty of Health Sciences, University of Sydney (2016-2017), with oversight of research governance for 300 academic staff. Togher is a former Conjoint Professor of Allied Health for the Western Sydney Local Health District in NSW (2023-2024). Togher is currently Director of Communication Sciences in the Faculty of Medicine and Health, and Director of the Acquired Brain Injury Communication Lab.

Research Impact Past 5 Years

Togher is the most published speech pathologist internationally in their field and recognized as a leader in the field of brain injury, ranked in the Top 1% worldwide for their expertise in Craniocerebral Trauma (Top 0.037% of 159, 763 authors 2012-22, expertscape.com) #1 author of 17,924 based on citation analysis in ISI Web of Science on 21 February, 2025 using search terms “injur*” and “communicat*”. Of Togher’s 280 publications, they are first, senior or corresponding author on 61% of papers, and 2nd author (signalling primary supervisor status on higher degree students’ publications on 19%), giving a total of 80% in 1st, 2nd or lead author. They collaborate with international researchers on 44% of papers, and 375 co-authors from 124 institutions.

Togher’s work has improved management of people with brain injury, particularly in evaluating and disseminating evidence-based advances for people with brain injury and their families. Togher is responsible for the first communication partner training program for families and friends of people with brain injury called *TBI Express* which is accessed by clinicians, families, and people with brain injury from more than 130 countries. Togher’s strong commitment to knowledge translation led to the 420-page *TBI Express* treatment manual being available from the Australasian Society for the Study of Brain Impairment Resources website and which is now in regular clinical use in the UK, USA, Canada, South Africa, New Zealand, Belgium, Sweden and The Netherlands. It has been adapted for video teleconferencing (*TBI Connect*) and via a responsive web design app (Convers-ABI-lity). Interact-ABI-lity, a self-directed training program for people wishing to learn about how to communicate with a person with brain injury has been accessed 4000 times from 28 countries since launch in Feb 2022.

Togher leads international practice guidelines, including the International Cognitive Rehabilitation Guidelines (INCOG, 2014, 2022). Their work is cited in ERABI (Canada, 2020), INESS-ONF, CASLPO (Canada 2021), and Iranian brain injury guidelines and their research has compelled changes to USA Workers Compensation Law and the World Health Organization Package of Interventions for Moderate to Severe TBI (2023) to be implemented by Ministries of Health worldwide. Togher is the sole Australian author of the social communication rehabilitation chapter in the latest edition of the American College of Rehabilitation Medicine’s Cognitive Rehabilitation Guidelines Textbook (2022).
