ARCHAEOLOGY

PRIZES

Dani Petocz Memorial Prize in Archaeology

Awarded for the best essay on a Near Eastern topic by an Archaeology Honours student. Established in 1984 by endowment by the family and friends of Mr Dani Petocz, a graduate student in the Department of Archaeology at the time of his death in 1984.

Frank Albert Prize for Prehistoric and Historical Archaeology

Awarded for the greatest proficiency in second year courses taught in the fields of Prehistoric and Historical Archaeology. In 1927 Frank Albert of Sydney donated 100 pounds to the University of Sydney in order to establish two prizes to recognise proficiency in first and second year anthropology (incorporating archaeology).

Graduates Prize in Prehistoric and Historical Archaeology

Awarded to the best student in any undergraduate course taught in the fields of Australian or Pacific archaeology, provided that the student's result is a High Distinction. Established in 1993 from donations from Prehistoric and Historical Archaeology graduates.

J.R.B. Stewart Prize in Near Eastern Archaeology

Awarded to the best student in the senior courses in Near Eastern Archaeology. Founded in 1971 by a gift from the widow, colleagues and friends of Professor J.R.B. Stewart to establish a prize in his memory.

Marcelle Rosina Whitehouse Prize in Archaeology

To be awarded to the best performing student in senior Archaeology units, provided that the student has been accepted for Honours in Archaeology the following year.

Established in memory of Marcelle Rosina Whitehouse (1922-2010), who valued the benefits of education and was an indefatigable traveller to the archaeological sites of the Middle East, North Africa and the Classical World.

Max Le Petit Memorial Prize for Classical Archaeology

Awarded to the best student in undergraduate Classical Archaeology. Established in 1948 by a gift of 200 pounds from Mr G. Le Petit, for two annual prizes in memory of his son.

Rob Thornley Memorial Prize

Awarded annually to the most outstanding student in First Year Archaeology, provided that the student enrols in Second Year Archaeology the following year.

Established in memory of Rob Thornley, Attendant of the Nicholson Museum 1995-2007, and his contribution to the teaching and learning environment for Archaeology students at the University of Sydney.

Thomas James Dunbabin Memorial Prize in Archaeology

Awarded to the student who shows greatest proficiency in Roman arts and archaeology in third year provided that the student's work is of sufficient merit. Established in 1985 by a donation of \$1,000 from NCR Australia Pty Ltd on the occasion of the First Australian Congress of Classical Archaeology and to commemorate the work of Thomas James Dunbabin, Reader in Classical Archaeology and Fellow of All Souls College University in Oxford, on Greek colonisation in Italy. Thomas James Dunbabin was a student at the University of Sydney in 1928 and 1929 before proceeding to Corpus Christi College, Oxford.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Carlyle Greenwell Research Scholarship

To assist Honours, Master of Arts (Research), MPhil or PhD student in the Department of Archaeology students to undertake a research project. Established from a 1961 bequest by the architect Carlyle Greenwell.

Hellenic Club Postgraduate Research Studentship in Classical Archaeology

Established in 1975 from a donation by the Hellenic Club to support students undertaking postgraduate research in Classical Archaeology within the Department of Archaeology at the University of Sydney.

Tom Austen Brown Postgraduate Research Completion Scholarship

Established in 2021, funded by the Tom Austen Bequest, to support a student to complete their research studies. Tom Austen Brown was a NSW solicitor who had a passion for First Nations archaeology and in the 1960s assembled a significant personal collection of Aboriginal stone artefacts. He completed a Bachelor of Arts degree majoring in Archaeology at the University of Sydney in 1974.

CLASSICS AND ANCIENT HISTORY

PRIZES

Ancient History Senior Essay Prize

Awarded for the best essay on an Ancient History topic from a student enrolled in an Ancient History, History or Classical Civilisation Senior option, provided that the essay is of sufficient merit. Established in 1994 from the proceeds of the Ancient History Study Day held in February 1994 and a donation from the Ancient History Society to establish an annual prize. Originally \$100.

Backhouse Prize for Greek and Latin

Awarded for the best Honours thesis in Greek or Latin, provided that the work is of sufficient merit. Established in 1940 following a bequest of 100 pounds from His Honour Judge Alfred Paxton Backhouse M.A., Fellow of the University Senate for fifty-two years (1887-1938).

Britta Petzl Memorial Prize In Ancient History

Awarded for the best Honours thesis in Ancient History, provided the work is of sufficient merit. Established in 1996 by a donation from the Petzl family in memory of Britta Petzl, an Honours graduate who was killed in a plane crash in Thailand in 1991 aged 22 years.

Dipak and Shanta Hor Prize for Classics and Ancient History

Awarded to the Best Performance in one or both Classical Languages at an intermediate level by a student in the Ancient History Major. Founded in 2017.

Eileen Groenewegen Prize in Classics and Ancient History

Awarded to a Bachelor of Arts student enrolled in a senior Ancient History unit (preferably ANHS3635) for the best essay on a historiographical topic. Established 2020.

Frederic Spencer Burnell Prize for Best Essay in Greek II or III

Awarded for the best essay written by a student in a senior course in Greek. Established in 1962 by a gift of 100 pounds by Mrs M.K. Burnell.

Frederick Lloyd Memorial Prize

For the best essay written by a third- or fourth-year student enrolled in Latin.

June Hartnett Prize for Proficiency in Second Year Ancient History

Awarded to the most outstanding student in second year Ancient History.

Established in 2004 by a donation from Léonie Hayne in memory of June Hartnett, a graduate of the University of Sydney with a particular interest in Latin and Ancient History.

Léonie Hayne Ancient History Junior Prize

Awarded to the most proficient student in at least 12 Junior units of Ancient History. Established in 1993 by public subscription. Known as 'The Ancient History Junior Prize' until 1997, when it was renamed to honour Léonie Hayne, a long standing member of the Department.

Max Le Petit Memorial Prize for Classical Greek

Awarded to the best student in Greek I, provided that the work is of sufficient merit. Established in 1948 by a gift of 200 pounds from Mr G. Le Petit, for two annual prizes in memory of his son.

Roderick West Prize for Latin

Awarded to the best performance in one or both Classcial Languages at a beginner's level by a student in the Ancient History major. Founded in 2017.

W.J. Woodhouse Memorial Prize for (Ancient) Greek

Awarded for outstanding work in one of the undergraduate courses in (Ancient) Greek, other than honours, provided that the work is of sufficient merit. Established in 1981 in memory of W.J. Woodhouse, Professor of Greek from 1901-37, by a donation of \$2,250 from his daughter, Miss L. Woodhouse.

Prize for Outstanding Achievement in 1st Year Cultural Studies

Awarded to the student who has excelled academically in first year Cultural Studies.

Prize for Outstanding Achievement in 1st Year Gender Studies

Awarded to the student who has excelled academically in first year Gender Studies.

Prize for Outstanding Achievement in 2nd Year Cultural Studies

Awarded to the student who has excelled academically in second year Cultural Studies.

Prize for Outstanding Achievement in 3rd Year Cultural Studies

Awarded to the student who has majored in Cultural Studies and excelled academically in third year Cultural Studies.

Prize for Outstanding Achievement in 3rd Year Gender Studies

Awarded to the student who has majored in Gender Studies and excelled academically in third year Gender Studies.

Vera Edith Thorpe Prize in Second Year Gender Studies

Awarded for the greatest proficiency in second year Gender Studies by a student in the Faculty of Arts. Established in 1989 by a gift of \$1000 from the Dean of the Faculty of Arts, Associate Professor Sybil M. Jack, in memory of her mother.

HISTORY

PRI7FS

A.E. (Tony) Cahill History Prize

Awarded to the best first year student in Late Modern European History, provided the work is of sufficient merit. Established in 2004 by friends, former students, colleagues and members of the family of Mr. A.E. (Tony) Cahill, a member of the History Department from 1963-1998.

Aisling Society of Sydney Prize for an Essay on Irish or Irish-Australian History

Awarded to the student enrolled in senior courses in either Celtic Studies or History who submits the best piece of written work in the field of Irish or Irish-Australian history, provided that the work is of sufficient merit. Established in 1987 following an offer by the Aisling Society of Sydney to sponsor a prize in the field of Irish-Australian history.

Charles Brunsdon Fletcher Prize for Pacific History

Awarded to an undergraduate in Arts for the best thesis involving research in Pacific History. Established in 1948 by a bequest of 100 pounds from Charles Brunsdon Fletcher, editor of the Sydney Morning Herald (1918-37) and Senate Fellow (1924-39).

Charles Trimby Burfitt Prize for the Study of Australian History Prior to 1900

Awarded to the student who is most proficient in courses of study relating to Australian history prior to 1900, provided that the work is of sufficient merit. Established in 1986 by a donation from Dr G.C.T. Burfitt-Williams to establish a prize in memory of his grandfather, Charles Trimby Burfitt, Honorary Secretary (1909-14), President (1915) and Fellow of the Royal Australian Society and a Fellow of the Royal Historical Society.

Ernest Bramsted Prize for Modern or Medieval European History

Awarded annually to a student in History IV for outstanding work in the field of modern or medieval European history, provided that the work is of sufficient merit. Established in 1970 in recognition of the contribution of Associate Professor Ernest K. Bramsted (lecturer 1952-67) to European Historical Studies.

George Arnold Wood Memorial Prize for History I

Awarded to the single best student in a first year History course. Founded in 1929 by a gift of 100 pounds from the widow, sister and family of Professor Wood, first Challis Professor of History, to establish two prizes in memory of the Professor and in continuance of the prize-giving in History instituted and continued by him during his occupancy of the Chair of History (1891-1928).

George Arnold Wood Memorial Prize for History II

Awarded to best performing student in second year History courses. Founded in 1929 by a gift of 100 pounds from the widow, sister and family of Professor Wood, first Challis Professor of History, to establish two prizes in memory of the Professor and in continuance of the prize-giving in History instituted and continued by him during his occupancy of the Chair of History (1891-1928).

George Vari Prize for History

Awarded in alternate years by: Dept. of History (odd yrs) for the highest marks in any junior UoS re the Middle Ages or Early Modern period; or by the Centre for Medieval Studies (even yrs) for highest marks in Medieval Studies, or Medieval Studies Honours.

G.S. Caird Scholarship in History II

Awarded to the best Bachelor of Arts student in second year History who is proceeding to History III. Founded in 1923 by a bequest of 4000 pounds from Miss Elizabeth R. Caird, for the purpose of founding in perpetuity such scholarships as the Council of the University shall think best.

Helen Newbon Bennett Memorial Prize for Senior History

Awarded annually to the student who writes the best essay in a Senior course in the Department. Established in 1943 by a gift of 75 pounds from various donors as a memorial to Helen Newbon Bennett (BA 1922), a journalist for the Daily Guardian and Smith's Weekly and foundation member of the Society of Women Writers (NSW).

History Department Prize for outstanding work in HSTY3901

Established in 2016. Awarded to the student who achieves the highest overall result in the unit of study.

History Department Prize for outstanding work in HSTY3902

Established in 2016. Awarded to the student who achieves the highest overall result in the unit of study.

History Department Prize for outstanding work in HSTY3903

Established in 2016. Awarded to the student who achieves the highest overall result in the unit of study.

History Department Prize for an outstanding essay on a subject relating to social justice and/or social inclusion

Established in 2016.

Isabel M. King Memorial Prize for History III

Awarded annually to the best student in senior units of History. Established in 1960 by a afft of 210 pounds from the Isabel King Memorial Fund Committee.

J.H.M. Nolan Memorial Prize for Proficiency in History

Awarded to the second year History student showing the most promise. Established in 1941 by a gift of 150 pounds from Miss V. Nolan.

Maud Stiles Memorial Prize in Senior History

Awarded awarded to the best female student in senior History. Established in 1941 by a gift from ex-pupils of Normanhurst School for a prize in memory of Mrs Maud Stiles.

Philippe Erdos Prize in History

Awarded annually to the student who submits the best thesis in History Honours, regardless of the subject or area, providing that the work is of sufficient merit and that the student has not been awarded any other prizes in the year of the award. Established in 1989 by a donation of \$10,000 to the University by Renee F. Erdos in memory of her father Philippe Erdos.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Australasian Pioneers' Club Travel Research Scholarship

Established 2008. To be granted to one or more honours or post-graduate students working in the field of Australian history or a related field, for the purpose of providing support for travel and accommodation expenses incurred in the course of their studies.

Undergraduate Equity Scholarships in History

Established in 2015 to provide assistance to undergraduate students studying history at the University of Sydney, particularly those from a low socio-economic background, who live in a regional or rural area, or identify as an Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander person.

PHILOSOPHY

PRIZES

Andrew Donald Campbell Memorial Prize

Awarded to the postgraduate student presenting the best essay in metaphysics or epistemology, preferably showing the most effective use of electronic information technology in the conduct of the research leading to the essay. Established in 1998 by a donation of \$2,000, from Professor and Mrs Keith Campbell as a memorial to their son, who died in an accident in October 1997.

Francis E. Snare Memorial Prize

Awarded to the student enrolled in second or third year Philosophy showing greatest proficiency in Moral and Political Philosophy, provided that the work is of sufficient merit. Established in 1991 by a donation by the Department of Traditional and Modern Philosophy for a prize in the area of Moral and Political Philosophy in memory of Dr F.E. Snare, a member of the Department from 1980 to 1990.

G.S. Caird Scholarship for Philosophy II

Awarded to the student who shows greatest proficiency in senior units of Philosophy at 2000 level. The scholar is required to remain enrolled in Senior units of Philosophy during the tenure of the scholarship (one year). Founded in 1923 by a bequest of 4000 pounds from Miss Elizabeth R Caird, for the purpose of founding in perpetuity such scholarships as the Council of the University shall think best.

John Anderson Prize for Best Thesis in Philosophy IV

Awarded to the student submitting the best Philosophy Honours thesis, provided that the work is of sufficient merit. Established in 1959 by a donation from the Sydney University Arts Society.

Lithgow Scholarship No III for Philosophy I

Awarded to the student who showed greatest proficiency in Junior units of Philosophy. The scholar is required to remain enrolled in Senior units of Philosophy at level II during the one-year tenure of the scholarship.

Lithgow Scholarship No IV for Philosophy III

Awarded annually to the student who showed greatest proficiency in the Senior Philosophy courses which are a qualification to enter Philosophy Honours in the following year. The scholar is required to remain enrolled in Philosophy Honours during the tenure of the scholarship (one year).

Lucy Firth Prize for Best Honours Thesis

Awarded for the best honours thesis written by a student in circumstances that negatively affect and/or challenge the recognition of the student's excellence. Established 2019.

The Time Prize

Awarded annually for the best piece of work in the preceding year by an undergraduate or postgraduate student on the subject of Time.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Anderson Completion Scholarship

Funded by the Alexander John Anderson Bequest, the Scholarship was established in 2020 to assist students to complete their PhD in Philosophy.

Lucy Firth Equity Honours Scholarship

Established in 2021 to provide assistance to students undertaking an Honours program at the School of Philosophical and Historical Inquiry who experience disadvantage or hardship.

Miss Firth graduated with a Bachelor of Arts from the University of Sydney and left a bequest in 1997 to provide opportunities for able students to gain from having a University education.
