



TUTOR INFORMATION

Westmead Clinical School (WCS) is based at Westmead Hospital, though facilities and sites for teaching in the Sydney Medical Program (SMP) extend across tutorial rooms, Clinical Skills Lab, Simulation Labs, hospital wards, clinics and associated institutes, hospitals and health service facilities. SMP students at WCS receive a very broad and complex clinical training, which requires many variously skilled and dedicated teachers. Teaching in the SMP is both highly valued and rewarding.

Tutors are required for teaching medical history taking, procedural skills, communication and physical examination skills at the bedside and tutors are recruited for teaching these skills across all years. In Stage 3, (includes third and fourth year) tutors are also needed in other activities such as clinical reasoning sessions, bedside tutorials, ethical discussions, online work and assessment.
