Dr Kylie Gwynne

Master of Human Services Griffith 2008 PhD (Aboriginal Health) Sydney 2017

We are honoured to welcome Dr Kylie Gwynne as our speaker tonight.

Dr Kylie Gwynne is the Executive Officer of Paediatrio, a cooperative joint venture between Sydney Children's Hospitals Network, the Children's Cancer Institute, and the Children's Medical Research Institute. Paediatrio was established to coordinate and integrate paediatric research in Sydney and potentially New South Wales.



Kylie is also an Adjunct Associate
Professor at Sydney Medical School
where she leads the research program
for the Poche Centre for Indigenous
Health. Her research focuses on the
co-design and delivery of culturally
safe, timely and relevant healthcare
services with Aboriginal people to
improve effectiveness, efficiency and
outcomes.

Since 2012, she has received \$6.17m in funding to co-design, deliver and evaluate services with Aboriginal people and includes new approaches to oral health, allied health and cardiovascular disease.

Kylie's work with the Poche Centre for Indigenous Health is shaping policy in NSW in the areas of rural and remote dentistry, graduate training and supervision, local workforce development, and new models of care.

Student Recognition Award	Any form of scholarship, prize or subsidy, including those awarded under the research training program
Prize	A payment or benefit that carries no condition of further study that is received by a student on the basis of either or both of prior academic performance or fulfilling relevant selection and eligibility criteria. The benefit can be monetary or non-monetary.
Scholarship	A payment or benefit to a student that is: - usually monetary - awarded on the basis of academic merit or potential, alone or in combination with other criteria - awarded in connection with ongoing or future study - subject to satisfactory future performance requirements - awarded for a specified period up to a maximum duration of a full course of study.
