

INFORMATION ON ONLINE ASSESSMENT DAY (FRIDAY 29 JANUARY 2021) FOR ELIGIBLE APPLICANTS FOR THE DOUBLE DEGREE MEDICINE PROGRAM (DDMP) AND DOUBLE DEGREE DENTISTRY PROGRAM (DDDP)

We are aware of the delayed NCEA results release this year. The University would like to provide some general information to ensure eligible applicants are equipped to meet the timeline and understand the IT requirements needed on Assessment Day. Applicants should rely on the official invitation sent on 21 January 2021 for the final details, including what to expect and what to present on the Day.

- Applicants who achieve the required ATAR results (or equivalent) will receive an invitation email from fmh.recruitment@sydney.edu.au on Thursday 21 January 2021 to attend the online Assessment Day.
- If you wish to accept the invitation, you must RSVP your attendance by 4pm on Monday 25 January 2021 as instructed in the invitation email.
- On Wednesday 27 January 2021 and after receipt of your RSVP, you will be provided with further information via email including the Zoom link to be used for the Assessment Day. Please expect to receive this email by Close of Business at 5pm.
- If you do not receive the email with Zoom link by 5pm on Wednesday 27 January 2021, please contact medicine.ugapplication@sydney.edu.au (for this purpose ONLY, no other emails will be responded to) immediately and no later than 11am on Thursday 28 January 2021.
- All dates and times listed are Sydney, Australia time and are subject to change depending on any unforeseen circumstances.

Note: Please check all mailboxes including the junk mailbox and promotions folders regularly for any correspondence from the University. It is the responsibility of the applicant to check their accounts; the University will not be held responsible for any unread email communication or for any resulting delays or disadvantage.

If you fail to RSVP by the deadline, your application for the Double Degree Medicine Program and/or Double Degree Dentistry Program for 2021 entry will be deemed to have lapsed and will not be considered further.

Eligible applicants will need access to a laptop/desktop computer with camera and microphone for the Assessment Day.

Assessment Day will be conducted via Zoom. Please see below tips that will help improve your assessment experience and minimise technical problems:

- Download the latest version of Zoom from zoom.us (on computer) or App Store (on Apple devices) or Google Play store (Android devices).
- Use a wired internet connection for consistency of connection. If you do not have a wired connection, ensure that your wireless connection is reliable enough to complete the assessment process.
- Test the speed of your connection at <http://www.speedtest.net/>. For good connections, we recommend 1 Mbps (megabit per second) as a bare minimum with 4 Mbps as a preferred minimum speed.
- Use a headset with a microphone for clarity.
- Test your microphone and speakers prior to the day.
