

HIRAID® IMPROVES SAFETY FOR EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT PATIENTS

HIRAID® (**H**istory including Infection risk, **R**ed flags, **A**ssessment, Intervention, **D**iagnostics, reassessment and communication) is the only validated emergency nursing framework. HIRAID® actions the seven essential elements of safe and high-quality emergency nursing and aligns with National Safety and Quality Health Service Standards.

In the largest trial ever conducted with emergency nurses, HIRAID® was implemented in 29 emergency departments in NSW and Victoria, with 106,047 patients and 1,377 emergency nurses, in a stepped-wedge cluster randomised controlled trial from June 2020 to February 2024.

This means that if HIRAID[®] was implemented in all EDs across Australia, there could be over 200,000* fewer patient deterioration events each year.

8.2% reduction in rapid response team calls related to emergency nursing care due to fewer delays and improved communication.
