



Sustainability and Social Entrepreneurship Example Study Plan

Social entrepreneurship considers social, environmental and cultural concerns in addition to profit. A critical aspect of social entrepreneurship, or social enterprise, is that it furthers a social mission. A number of organisations, including non-government organisations (NGOs), support social enterprise.

By adding an understanding of social entrepreneurship to your foundation in sustainability, you will add value to your experience in NGOs or non-profit organisations, or you develop your own start-up business.
