Major equipment purchases will also not be funded. All costs need to be specified in a budget table and justified in the text. (see EOI for funding timetable)

## 5) The Research Team

Please demonstrate the ability of the research team. A research team leader should be identified. Note that this person must be an ECR. Attach a CV for each research team member of no more than 500 words per member (qualifications, short bio and relevant publications), each which includes all contact details. Please demonstrate how the project might improve the research capacity of members of the research team, especially the Early Career Researchers.
