



School of Chemical Engineering Prize for First Year Environmental Engineering

Terms and Conditions

1. Background

- a. The First Year Environmental Engineering Prize is awarded to the first-year student from the School of Chemical and Biomolecular Engineering who achieved the highest average mark in relevant units of study in the Bachelor of Engineering Honours (Environmental Engineering) degree.
- b. This award is funded by School of Chemical and Biomolecular Engineering.

2. Eligibility Criteria

- a. Students must have been enrolled in the first year of the Bachelor of Engineering Honours (Environmental Engineering) degree in the previous calendar year.
- b. Students must have completed the following units of study in the previous calendar year:
 - I. ENVE1001 Introduction to Environmental Engineering,
 - II. CHNG1103 Conservation of Mass and Energy, and
 - III. CHNG1106 Engineering for a Sustainable Society.
- c. Students must have attempted and passed 48 credit points in the previous calendar year.

3. Selection Criteria

- a. The award will be awarded to the eligible student with the highest average mark in:
 - I. ENVE1001 Introduction to Environmental Engineering,
 - II. CHNG1103 Conservation of Mass and Energy, and
 - III. CHNG1106 Engineering for a Sustainable Society.
- b. The award will be awarded by the Head of School, School of Chemical and Biomolecular Engineering, or their nominated delegate(s).

4. Value

- a. This award has a value of \$100 and will be paid as a one-off payment.
- b. If more than one student is of equal merit, the value of the award will be equally shared by the recipients.
- c. No other amount is payable.
- d. The award will be awarded subject to the availability of funds.
