

Alan John Williams Prize

Terms and Conditions

1. Background

- a. The Dr Alan John Williams prize is awarded to first-year students enrolled in undergraduate science degree.
- b. This Prize has been generously funded by the late Dr Alan John Williams who graduated from a Bachelor, Master, and PhD at the University of Sydney and went on to become a lecturer at the University.

2. Eligibility Criteria

- a. To be considered eligible for this Prize, students must be a first-year student enrolled in an undergraduate science degree.
- b. Completed unit of study CHEM1011/1111, CHEM1911/1991, CHEM1012/1112 or CHEM1912/1992 in their first year of enrolment.

3. Selection Criteria

- a. The Prize will be awarded based on academic merit to the student with the highest mark in the following chemistry units of study:
 - i. CHEM1011/1111,
 - ii. CHEM1911/1991,
 - iii.CHEM1012/1112, or
 - iv.CHEM1912/1992
- b. The Prize will be awarded by the Head of School of Chemistry, or their nominated delegate(s).

4. Value

- a. This Prize has a value of \$500 and will be paid as a one-off payment.
- b. In the event multiple recipients are selected, the value of the prize will be shared equally.
- c. No other amount is payable.
- d. The Prize will be awarded subject to the availability of funds.

5. Ongoing Eligibility

6. Termination

- a. The University reserves the right to withdraw the Prize, if the University determines that the student is guilty of serious misconduct, including, but not limited to, having provided false or misleading information that has a relationship to the awarding of this Prize.
