



MAK Halliday Medal

Terms and Conditions

1. Background

- a. The MAK Halliday Medal is awarded for outstanding merit in the Master of Arts program in Applied Linguistics.
- b. This Prize is funded by the staff of the Department of Linguistics to honour Professor Halliday who was appointed to the Chair of Linguistics in 1975 and retired in 1987.

2. Eligibility Criteria

- a. Students must be enrolled in a Master of Arts program in Linguistics, School of Humanities at the University of Sydney.

3. Selection Criteria

- a. The Prize will be awarded to a student in the Master of Arts in Applied Linguistics who obtains both:
 - I. a High Distinction in one of the capstone units, and
 - II. an average of 80% across six other 7000-level LNGS units, with no LNGS unit being below 65%.
- b. If more than one student is of equal merit the prize may be shared.
- c. The prize will be awarded by the Head of Linguistics of their nominated delegate.

4. Value

- a. This award has no monetary value.

5. Termination

- a. The University reserves the right to withdraw the Prize, if the University determines that the student is guilty of serious misconduct, including, but not limited to, having provided false or misleading information that has a relationship to the awarding of this Prize.
- b. Once withdrawn the Prize will not be reinstated unless due to University error.
