



Sydney Policy Reform Project Prize

Terms and Conditions

1. Background

- a. The Sydney Policy Reform Project Prize acknowledges outstanding performance of students who have participated in the Sydney Policy Reform Project.
- b. This Prize is funded by the Yim Family Foundation.

2. Eligibility Criteria

- a. All students who participate in the Sydney Policy Reform Project from Semester 2, 2021 onwards are eligible for, and are automatically considered for, the award of this Prize in the semester they participate.
- b. No separate application is required.

3. Selection Criteria

- a. The Prize will be awarded to the students who completed the best written work as part of their participation in the Sydney Policy Reform Project.
- b. Preference will be given to applicants who provide written work of sustained quality.
- c. The Prize will be awarded by a selection committee consisting of:
 - I. an Associate Dean within the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences or their nominated delegate,
 - II. a senior staff member of Student Affairs and Engagement within the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences, and
 - III. at least one other academic with policy and law reform experience.

4. Value

- a. The value of the prize is \$1250.
- b. The value of the Prize will be shared equally among each of the students who completed the successful written work.
- c. No other amount is payable.
- d. The Prize will be awarded subject to the availability of funds.

5. Ongoing Eligibility



Sydney Policy Reform Project Prize

- a. None apply.

6. Termination

- a. The University reserves the right to withdraw the Prize, if the University determines that the student is guilty of serious misconduct, including, but not limited to, having provided false or misleading information that has a relationship to the awarding of this Prize.
- b. Once withdrawn the Prize will not be reinstated unless due to University error.
