

The Frank Stilwell Award in Political Economy

Terms and Conditions

1. Background

Established in 2013, The Frank Stilwell Award in Political Economy is awarded to the
postgraduate research student in the Department of Political Economy at the University of
Sydney judged to be the most meritorious

2. Eligibility Criteria

- a. To be considered eligible for this Prize, students must be enrolled full-time in the Department of Political Economy at the University of Sydney in one of the following degrees:
 - I. PhD,
 - II. Master of Philosophy, or
 - III. Master of Arts (Research).
- b. Students who currently receive a Postgraduate Research Scholarship from the University of Sydney that provides a stipend allowance are not eligible for this prize.
- c. Students must be able to demonstrate hardship.

3. Selection Criteria

- a. The Prize will be awarded based on academic merit and hardship to the student judged to be the most meritorious by the department's Scholarships Award Committee.
- b. One prize will be awarded each year.
- c. Priority will be given to students enrolled in PhD.
- d. The Prize will be awarded by the Head of the Department of Political Economy in consultation with the Postgraduate Research Student Director of the Department of Political Economy and academic staff in the Department of Political Economy.

4. Value

a. This value of the Prize will be determined by the Scholarships Award Committee and will have a maximum amount of \$10,000. This amount will be paid as a one-off payment.

- b. If two or more students are of equal merit the value of the prize may be shared.
- c. No other amount is payable.
- d. The Prize will be awarded subject to the availability of funds.
- 5. Ongoing Eligibility
- a. None apply.

6. Termination

- a. The University reserves the right to withdraw the Prize, if the University determines that the student is guilty of serious misconduct, including, but not limited to, having provided false or misleading information that has a relationship to the awarding of this Prize.
- b. Once withdrawn the Prize will not be reinstated.
