



Electric Energy Society of Australia Best Power Engineering Student Prize

Terms and Conditions

1. Background

- a. The Electric Energy Society of Australia (EESA) Best Power Engineering Student Prize is awarded to the final year graduating student with the highest Engineering Honours Weighted Average Mark (EIHWAM).
- b. This Prize is funded by the EESA.

2. Eligibility Criteria

- a. Students must have completed the course requirements of one of the following courses at the University of Sydney in the relevant calendar year.
 - I. Bachelor of Engineering Honours (Electrical)
 - II. Bachelor of Engineering Honours (Electrical) and Bachelor of Arts
 - III. Bachelor of Engineering Honours (Electrical) and Bachelor of Commerce
 - IV. Bachelor of Engineering Honours (Electrical) and Bachelor of Design in Architecture
 - V. Bachelor of Engineering Honours (Electrical) and Bachelor of Laws
 - VI. Bachelor of Engineering Honours (Electrical) and Bachelor of Project Management, or
 - VII. Bachelor of Engineering Honours (Electrical) and Bachelor of Science.
- b. Students must have completed a minimum of 30 credit points of the following units of study:
 - I. ELEC5205: High Voltage Engineering
 - II. ELEC5206: Sustainable Energy Systems
 - III. ELEC5207: Advanced Power Conversion Technologies
 - IV. ELEC5208: Active Distribution Systems
 - V. ELEC5211: Power System Dynamics and Control
 - VI. ELEC5212: Power System Planning and Markets
 - VII. ELEC5213: Engineering Optimisation
 - VIII. ELEC3204: Power Electronics and Applications
 - IX. ELEC3206: Electrical Energy Conversion Systems
 - X. ELEC5204: Power Systems Analysis and Protection

3. Selection Criteria

- a. The Prize will be awarded to the student with the highest Engineering Honours Weighted Average Mark (EIHWAM) in the relevant calendar year.

4. Value



Electric Energy Society of Australia Best Power Engineering Student Prize

- a. This Prize will provide the following benefits:
 - I. \$500 one off payment, and
 - II. Registration costs of the EESA Annual Conference.
- b. If more than one student is of equal merit, the \$500 will be split equally between the recipients.
- c. No other amount is payable.
- d. The Prize will be awarded subject to the availability of funds.

5. Termination

- a. The University reserves the right to withdraw the Prize if the University determines that the student is guilty of serious misconduct, including, but not limited to, having provided false or misleading information that has a relationship to the awarding of this Prize.
- b. Once withdrawn, the Prize will not be reinstated unless due to University error.
