Mr Malouf, who worked for a number of years as a lecturer in the English Department of the University, is a prize-winning novelist and poet.

Twenty one years after giving up an academic career to pursue the challenges of life as a full-time writer, David Malouf returned to be honoured by the University.

Awarding the acclaimed author an honorary degree of Doctor of Letters, the Chancellor, Dame Leonie Kramer, described her former colleague as an "inspiration to all, one who has provided an understanding of the human condition".

Although initially making his mark as a poet, David Malouf received national and international attention for novels such such as *Jonno* (1975) and *An Imaginary Life* (1978). His three major works published in the 1990s – *The Great World, Remembering Babylon* and *Conversations at Curlow Creek* – have brought numerous prizes and even greated recognition.
