#### Administrative History:

Thomas Arthur Rose was born on the 28<sup>th</sup> June 1916. He obtained his leaving certificate in 1932 and then attended Armidale Teaching Training College. After this he taught in various schools until 1945.

While teaching at the Enmore Activity School, from 1940-1944, he attended Sydney University as an evening student studying for a BA. He graduated in 1944 with BA First Class Honours and University Medal in Philosophy. In 1953 he graduated MA with First Class Honours and University Medal in Philosophy.

Before his appointment at Sydney University as a lecturer in Philosophy in 1945, Rose conducted classes in Literature and Philosophy for the Newcastle branch of the WEA. He also conducted tutorial classes in Logic, Philosophy and Moral Philosophy for the Tutorial Class Department in Sydney.

Rose introduced the study of mathematical Logic into the work of the Philosophy Department in 1951. Up until that time logic taught in the Department was mainly Aristotelian. In 1954 he was appointed Senior Lecturer.

In 1956 he spent the year at the University of Oxford on a Nuffield Fellowship. Rose was largely responsible for the considerable departmental teaching of logic (especially beyond first year) in the Philosophy Department. In 1968, he introduced a post graduate course in Goedel.

In 1969 Rose became an Associate Professor and retired in 1978.
