## Information and support regarding Chinese Ministry for Education announcement

The Chinese Ministry for Education has announced that it will only acknowledge degrees awarded to students attending in-person classes from Semester 1 2023 onwards. <u>Learn more about the announcement</u>.

If you are unable to travel to Sydney, for example you have not yet received your visa or you are unable to book a flight, we recommend you keep all records of your attempts to make arrangements to resume on-campus study. If you are unable to study remotely in Semester 1 and unable to make it to Sydney, you may need to consider <u>suspending your studies</u> or <u>deferring your offer</u>.

If you have not been able to arrive in Sydney and change your units to on campus offerings by the last day to add (Friday 3 March), we will provide you with a letter confirming that the University was unable to change your study mode to in-person. We can provide this to you after the census date.

We understand this sudden announcement may be stressful for some students – <u>the University is here to support you</u>. For more information and answers to frequently asked questions, <u>visit our study information page</u>.

#### Need to know

 If you are travelling from China, Hong Kong or Macau, you must provide evidence of a negative COVID-19 test taken in the last 48 hours before your scheduled departure date to Australia. <u>Learn more</u>.
