

COVID-19 testing requirements for travellers from China, Hong Kong and Macau

We hope you're feeling ready for a new year of study and we look forward welcoming you for Semester 1 2023. Whether you are returning to Sydney or arriving for the first time, we are so excited to see you on campus!

We're writing to you with updated advice about travelling to Sydney, your arrival and the University support that is available to you.

Travel requirements

Many students will already be aware of the recently announced Australian Government COVID-19 testing requirements for travellers from China, Hong Kong and Macau. If you are travelling from these regions, you are currently required to undertake a COVID-19 test within the 48 hours prior to travel and show evidence of a negative test result when travelling to Australia.

Each province/city may have different procedures for local COVID testing facilities so we recommend you familiarise yourself with the process in your location to ensure you meet the requirements to board your flight. You may also wish to check with your air carrier for the requirements and process for your check-in for your flight to Australia.

Arrival in Sydney

The University is here to support you while you plan your travel, upon your arrival in Sydney and whilst you continue your studies. Student accommodation

We understand it can be difficult to organise accommodation before you arrive, and many housing options may already be full at this stage. To make the process a little easier, the University has

worked with Scape, a student accommodation provider, to secure a number of places for international students studying in 2023.

If you're interested in this option, make sure you apply to live at Scape as soon as possible.

Our Welcome Program

We recommend you plan your arrival so that you can join our Welcome activities, which will take place between 6 and 24 February. You're invited to join us regardless of whether you are a new or continuing student. Use this opportunity to reintroduce yourself to your peers and to the campus and to register for events using the Welcome Planner.
