

Police operation on our Camperdown Campus

2 July 2024

Dear students,

I am shocked and saddened to inform you that a student in our community was attacked on our Camperdown Campus this morning in what police believe is an isolated incident. The student is in hospital and is in a serious but stable condition.

NSW Police have arrested the alleged attacker and have assured us that there is no ongoing threat to the community.

A NSW Police operation is currently underway on our campus and we are assisting police with their investigation. As a precautionary measure, several buildings have been placed on secure mode. Students and staff will need to use their swipe card to access the following locations:
