## About the survey

The annual SES is a comprehensive study of current higher education students in Australia. The SES is administered by the <u>Social Research Centre</u>, and students eligible to participate will receive an invitation to complete the survey from <u>ses@srcentre.com.au</u>.

I encourage you to share your feedback openly and honestly as the results of this survey will help us enhance teaching and learning at the University, and improve our course offerings, student services and campus facilities. Your feedback also supports the government and higher education sector improve the student experience across Australia.

The SES gathers information on five facets of students' learning experience: Skills Development, Learner Engagement, Teaching Quality, Student Support, and Learning Resources.

The survey takes approximately 10-15 minutes to complete, and all responses are confidential and aggregated for reporting purposes. The SES will be open until Sunday 13 October.

While participation is optional, if you receive the survey, I highly encourage you to participate. This is your opportunity to tell us what it's like being a University of Sydney student, and actively

contribute to shaping the future of higher education in Australia.

I would like to reiterate that responses to this survey are anonymous and will be permanently delinked from contact information used to invite you to participate.
