

## What is a bursary?

There are several ways the University provides support for students experiencing financial difficulty and the most common is a one-off payment called a bursary. This can be up to \$2,000 and due to the circumstances caused by COVID-19, both domestic and international students may apply more than once in 2020.

There are also supermarket vouchers of up to \$250 a fortnight now available, which can be offered along with or as part of a bursary support package. Find out how to apply for a bursary.
