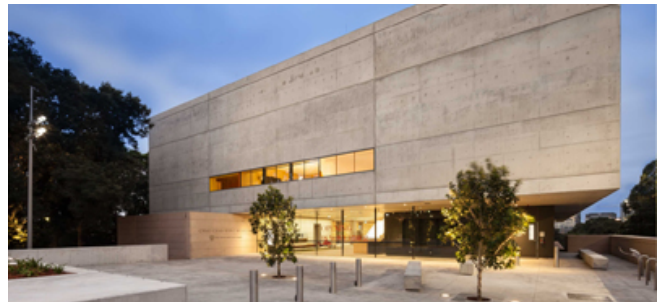
What you need to know about end of semester exams

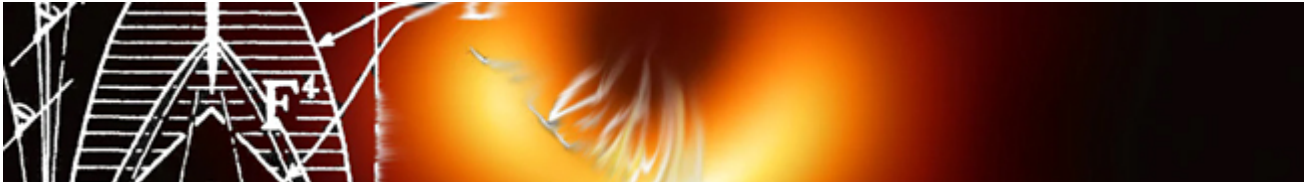
