Keeping our community COVID-safe

Public Health Order amended for students coming to campus

The Public Health Orders (PHO) have been amended overnight with a significant change
for the University. The PHO requiring authorised workers to show evidence of vaccination
(or exemption) and a permit to leave their LGA for work no longer applies to students.
Therefore students coming to campus for study will not be required to produce evidence of
vaccination or obtain a permit. All other <u>requirements</u> of the Greater Sydney stay-at-home
orders continue to apply, including additional restrictions for LGAs of concern.

Campus conditions of entry

Everyone coming to campus needs to comply with Public Health Orders (PHOs) including
wearing a mask or providing proof of exemption, as part of our <u>conditions of entry</u>. If you
come to campus, you will be required to <u>sign a declaration</u>, acknowledging these conditions.
You can also access the declaration form via the <u>Sydney Uni app</u> or complete a physical
form upon entry if you don't have a smartphone.

Priority Pfizer appointments

 If you are aged 16 to 39 and live in NSW's Local Government Areas (LGAs) of concern or the Sydney Local Health District, you can <u>make a booking to get a Pfizer vaccine</u>. More information about availability and access to vaccinations is available on the <u>NSW Health</u> <u>website</u>.

A message from the Vice-Chancellor

Dear students.

Over recent days I have watched with concern the distressing news of the political unrest unfolding in Afghanistan, which has seen many Afghanis fleeing for their lives. On behalf of the University, I extend my sincere sympathy to anyone in our community who has been directly affected by these events, and to the people of Afghanistan.

We have reached out directly to students of Afghan citizenship to offer additional support including

special consideration, peer support and counselling. We are also consulting with the Sydney University Afghan Society about how we can best support the Afghan student community with academic, psychological and other practical support, with a view to considering how we help both current and future students.

Students in Australia can <u>talk with one of our University counsellors</u>, including during evenings and on weekends. Support is also available for our students overseas and <u>more information is</u> available on our student website.

I also acknowledge that this is a challenging time for the Australian veteran community. Students who are veterans, or have family members who have served in Afghanistan, who may be experiencing distress about this situation can access a <u>free and confidential counselling service</u> specifically to support ADF families.

Our thoughts are with all people experiencing suffering throughout the world, in particular the people of Afghanistan.
