Australian borders open for international students

Great news! The Australian Government has announced that as of 1 December 2021, international students who are fully vaccinated with a <u>TGA approved vaccine</u> will not be required to apply for a travel exemption and will not be required to quarantine on arrival in NSW. This is an exciting development, and we look forward to many more of our students returning to Sydney in 2022. If you are seeking information about independent travel to Sydney and what you need to plan for, please visit the <u>Australian Government website</u>.

The <u>International Arrivals Pilot Program</u> will continue as planned, with the University providing a supported return program for current students who are eligible and choose to participate. The first charter flight of international students is due to arrive on 6 December 2021.

We're looking forward to our campus opening up in 2022 and we are excited to have you back with us next year. In the meantime, we will continue to offer remote learning for offshore international students who are unable to join us for Semester 1.
