Update: strike action on campus

Following yesterday's strike action on campus, the University has received reports of a number of concerning incidents involving students and staff experiencing intimidation and aggression from protesters. While the University respects the rights of union members to strike and to hold peaceful pickets and protests, we condemn the use of violence and intimidation to uphold picket lines.

It's important to understand that protesters may speak to students and staff at the picket lines about why they are striking, but it is unlawful for them to prevent access to campus spaces. We expect everyone coming to campus to behave respectfully: any behaviour that jeopardises the safety of others is unacceptable.

We will continue to monitor the situation on campus in order to maintain the safety of our students and staff. The University will remain open as previously communicated, with most classes expected to go ahead as normal.
