Important information about financial scams targeting students

The University is aware of some scams which have impacted students and would like to ensure you are aware of these potential recent scams and that support is available to you.

Scammers may approach you in person or contact you via phone, email or text message. They will usually pretend to be from an official organisation and may falsely claim to know about your family, claim that your visa or studies may be at risk, or that you are in trouble with the police. If someone approaches you in person or contacts you demanding money or personal information, please don't panic, don't engage with them, and don't agree to anything. If you think someone has your bank details, please contact your financial institution as soon as possible.

If you feel threatened or concerned, make sure you seek advice from someone you trust. There is free and confidential support at the University. An <u>SRC</u> or <u>SUPRA</u> caseworker can help you to understand if the request or communication you have received is legitimate. International students also have 24/7 <u>on demand access to wellbeing and safety professionals through the Sonder app</u>. If someone continues to harass you and causes you to feel unsafe, please reach out to emergency services.
