Simple extensions and special consideration

While you're studying, there may be circumstances such as illness, injury or misadventure that affect your academic performance. Our simple extension and special consideration process is in place to support you in these situations.

If you encounter a problem submitting your in-class assessment, quiz or small test on time, you may be able to arrange an extension of five calendar days through a simple extension.

You may also be eligible to apply for special consideration if you have exceptional circumstances or essential commitments that significantly affect your study.
