#### Recent data breach

The University of Sydney is aware of a data breach involving one third-party provider which has resulted in a limited number of recently applied and enrolled international applicants' personal data being accessed. We took immediate steps to secure our systems and contain the incident. At this stage our provisional findings indicate that no domestic students, staff, alumni or donors' data has been affected. We have emailed our international students and more information is available on our website.

### Stay alert to scams

International students are currently being targeted by a scam email that is requesting large sums of money be deposited into a domestic bank account as part of an Australian Government personal asset certificate for international students. This is a scam known as email phishing. If you receive this email, do not open it or clink on any links in the email. You can report a scam to the National Anti-Scam Centre through the ACCC. - If you have a disability, medical condition, or carer responsibilities (temporary or ongoing) which may disadvantage you in your formal examinations, you may be eligible for reasonable adjustments. To be approved for adjustments in your Semester 2 formal exams, you will need to book a consultation appointment and be registered with Inclusion and Disability Services by Wednesday 4 October. 
## **2023 Dr Charles Perkins Oration** and Memorial Prize
