#### Update your electoral details to vote in the referendum on 14 October

The Voice to Parliament referendum will be held on Saturday 14 October 2023. Voting in the referendum is your democratic right and an opportunity to have your views represented. You can check your electoral enrolment, make sure that your details are up to date or enrol for the first time by visiting the Australian Electoral Commission website.

#### **Notices**

- On 20 September we will be conducting a test exercise of our mass messaging system, which we use to communicate with students and staff in the event of an emergency. The message will be sent from +61 439 799 520. We would also like to remind students to keep your contact details up to date in Sydney Student.
- On-campus polling for the 2023 Annual Elections for the Students' Representative Council (SRC) will be held on 19, 20 and 21 September 2023. All University of Sydney students enrolled in undergraduate degrees or diplomas and other non-degree students are eligible to vote. A list of elections and polling locations are available on the SRC website.
- If you have a disability, medical condition, or carer responsibilities (temporary or ongoing) which may disadvantage you in your formal examinations, you may be eligible for reasonable adjustments. To be approved for adjustments in your Semester 2 formal exams, you will need to book a consultation appointment and be registered with Inclusion and Disability Services (IDS) by Wednesday 4 October.
