Supporting yourself and others in the lead up to the referendum

Referendum day is on Saturday 14 October. Polling places will be open between 8 am and 6 pm, local time, on voting day.

Over the next few weeks, it's important to keep the wellbeing of yourself and others in mind, and demonstrate respect and sensitivity towards your peers. This includes recognising that Aboriginal

and Torres Strait Islander Peoples are not responsible for educating you about the Voice to Parliament. The AEC has a comprehensive resource list on their website, including <u>where to vote</u>, <u>how to complete the ballot paper</u> and the <u>official Yes/No cases</u>. Elisa Arcioni, Associate Professor in Constitutional Law, is also hosting a drop-in Q&A session at the Law Foyer on Tuesday 10 October, 11:30 am to 12:30 pm, to answer any questions you may have on the referendum.

Educational videos are also available in <u>Traditional Chinese (Voice Referendum explainer)</u> and <u>Simplified Chinese (Voice Referendum explainer)</u>.


15 Oct | Living on the Edge: River Country Community Day
