## **Transgender Awareness Week**

Today marks the beginning of <u>Transgender</u> Awareness Week (13–19 November), an opportunity to celebrate Trans and Gender Diverse (TGD) vitality and increase our collective understanding of the role we all play in making our communities safer for TGD people.



We're committed to providing affirming experiences for <u>brotherboy</u>, <u>sistergirl</u>, trans, gender diverse and non-binary students through internal and external community led support. Learn about <u>support available for students affirming their gender</u>, find out who your <u>LGBTQIA+ student support liaison officers</u> are and check out <u>TransHub</u>, an information and resource hub for TGD people, their loved ones and allies.

The Mosaic and Pride Network are also hosting <u>"Say My Name and Pronoun"</u>, a <u>lunchtime event on 21 November</u>, to discuss championing name pronunciation, the correct use of pronouns, and accountable diversity and inclusion.


#### Watch

## Study with New York University in Sydney


