

Need to know

Has someone reached out to you claiming to be a tutoring service?

You may be approached by companies claiming to offer tutoring assistance – 'assignment help', 'exam help', 'study groups', 'essay writing' or similar. But these costly services are often not legitimate and if you engage with them, you risk taking part in contract cheating. Contract cheating is against the University's Academic Integrity Policy and is illegal under Australian law. Don't become a victim of contract cheating. Seek legitimate support from the University – it's free.
