   <u>Student</u> at any time? Updating your personal details will allow us to refer to you correctly and help us create a safe and inclusive environment for everyone.

#### Asbestos contaminated mulch

The NSW Environment Protection Authority (EPA) has contacted the University as part of its investigation into asbestos contaminated mulch across NSW, advising that a small amount of mulch the University purchased from a third party may be contaminated.

We have identified where the mulch has been used and are fencing off the following three locations for testing. While the mulch is undisturbed its presence does not pose a significant risk to our community.

- Science Road, opposite Heydon-Laurence Building (A08)
- Manning Road, near John Woolley Building (A20)
- Wilkinson Axis, near a pedestrian footpath between Science Road and Manning Road.

You can continue to move around campus as normal, but you should avoid the signposted areas disclosed above. We will keep you updated as the situation evolves. For more information, visit the notices page.
