### **Beware of money muling**

If someone asks you to move money through your bank account in exchange for payment, they're asking you to be a money mule. Money muling, also known as money laundering, is a serious crime.

If you believe someone has contacted you online or in-person to be a money mule, you should:


- · stop all communication with the person
- · immediately contact your bank so they can stop any transactions
- report to police using the 'Report' button at <u>www.cyber.gov.au</u>

#### Need to know


- The mulch identified as being potentially contaminated with asbestos at our Camperdown
  Campus has been tested and analysed. All results have returned negative for the presence
  of asbestos. As such, the mulch no longer poses a potential health risk to our community.

- From March until September, the J10 Shepherd St Car Park will be undergoing remediation works to ensure building safety and compliance. There will be a staged closure of car park spaces during the works, however emergency access and most parking spaces will remain usable during semester. ### Understanding your academic responsibilities as a student

As a student of the University, you are responsible for taking part in your education in an honest and authentic manner. If you started a new undergraduate or postgraduate coursework degree this semester, you must <u>complete the Academic Honesty Education Module (AHEM)</u> in Canvas by census on 2 April.

The module includes information about your roles and responsibilities as a student, as well as <a href="Legitimate University support services">Legitimate University support services</a> such as same-day assignment feedback service <a href="Studiosity">Studiosity</a>, which you can access after you enrol in the <a href="Learning Hub Canvas site">Learning Hub Canvas site</a>.

Be very careful about engaging with any service that claims to offer academic support, such as coaching, tutoring, and study materials. Many of these services are not legitimate and could result in penalties against you for 'contract cheating'. These services might also expose you to financial and data risks, or scams.
