 also need to do this by census. There are a range of <u>academic and wellbeing support</u>
 <u>services</u> available to you if you need help with your studies.

the Sydney Abroad Fair this Tuesday 19 March, 10:30 am to 2:30 pm on Eastern Avenue.


Unlock your entrepreneurial spirit with INCiTE
