- Voting for University of Sydney Union (USU) Board Directors begins on Monday 6 May. The
 USU is run by students, for students, and is responsible for clubs and societies, gigs,
 festivals and more. Make sure you're eligible to vote for your next USU Board Directors by
 becoming a USU member by 4 pm Friday 3 May. <u>USU membership</u> is free and it's your
 ticket to getting the most out of uni life.
- The University's new preferred Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) provider is Bupa. Students with existing access to the University's previous preferred provider, Allianz, are not affected by this change.
- A brand-new <u>library space for Higher Degree by Research (HDR) students</u> is now open. The renovated space is for all current HDR students and features a quiet study area with a variety of lounge seating and group study areas, as well as dock-your-own-device monitors, a small kitchenette and lockers.

Register with Inclusion and Disability Services for exam support

If you have a disability, medical condition, or carer responsibilities (temporary or ongoing) which could disadvantage you in your formal examinations, you may be eligible for reasonable adjustments through Inclusion and Disability Services. To be approved for adjustments in your Semester 1 formal exams, you will need to apply to register, book a consultation appointment, and be registered with Inclusion and Disability Services by Wednesday 24 April.
