- The Campus Access Policy provides clearer information about our expectations and requirements of conduct on campus. <u>Answers to frequently asked questions (FAQs) about</u> <u>the Campus Access Policy</u> are now available to help you understand the policy.

- Student nominations open on Monday 12 August for Senate, Academic Board, Faculty Board, University School Board, Faculty, and University School positions. - If you have a disability, medical condition, or carer responsibilities (temporary or ongoing) which may disadvantage you in your formal examinations, you may be eligible for reasonable adjustments through <u>Inclusion and Disability Services (IDS)</u>. To be approved for adjustments in your Semester 2 formal exams, you will need to be registered with IDS by Wednesday 25 September.
- We're committed to ensuring you understand sexual consent and what respectful
  relationships look like. If you're a new student or have transferred courses this semester,
  you must complete the compulsory <u>Consent Matters module</u> on Canvas. If you don't
  complete this module by Monday 2 September, you will not be able to access your results
  at the end of semester, unless you've received an exemption.
