Dear students,

During the Welcome period, we have seen a concerning increase in advertising activity from suspected contract cheating companies on and near campus.

'Contract cheating' is when all or part of a student's work is done by someone else, usually in exchange for money. Contract cheating companies might call themselves 'tutoring' services, homework helpers, ghost writers, exam helpers, or similar. They may even appear to be connected with the University referencing our Units of Study or by using our brand colours and logos.


