- The <u>census date</u> for Semester 2 is Monday, 2 September. Double check your units of study, and make sure you've submitted any HELP assistance forms and paid any necessary fees. If you'd like to <u>withdraw from any units of study</u>, <u>suspend your</u> <u>studies</u> or <u>discontinue your course</u> you'll also need to do this by census.
