If you are unable to sit an exam or require a longer period of time to complete an assignment, you may be able to apply for <u>special consideration</u>.

Ensure your location and residential address are up to date in Sydney Student

As a student visa holder, it's important to comply with your visa requirements, one of which is providing your location and residential address once you arrive in Australia and start your studies.

Make sure your Australian residential address, USI (Unique Student Identifier) and mobile phone number are updated in Sydney Student, as well as your status as 'Onshore' if you've been studying in Australia this semester.
