 our <u>Consent Matters module on Canvas</u> by Friday 1 November. If you fail to complete the
 module by the deadline, you will not be able to access your results at the end of semester,
 unless you've received an exemption from the Safer Communities Office.
- The Mpox vaccine is available at the Health Service. This vaccine is free for all eligible
 patients. You can check your eligibility via the <u>NSW Health website</u>. HPV vaccine
 appointments can also be made along with other travel and study related vaccines.


