Conduct of University Elections

The University of Sydney is currently running a <u>ballot (PDF, 178KB)</u> for student positions on Senate, Academic Board, Faculty and University Schools, Faculty Boards and University Schools Boards. This election commenced on Tuesday 8 October 2024 and will conclude at 4.00pm on Thursday 24 October 2024.

The University has received a number of reports surrounding alleged behavior of students that, have been referred to the Student Affairs Unit, and if confirmed, may be misconduct under the <u>University of Sydney (Student Discipline) Rule 2016 (PDF, 399KB)</u>

All students at the University are expected to behave in accordance with the <u>Student Charter 2020</u> (<u>PDF, 224 KB</u>), and act ethically and with respect, integrity, and honesty in all dealings with the University and other students.

Candidates for Undergraduate and Postgraduate Student Fellows of Senate are issued with Guidelines from the Returning Officer which set out the expectations of candidates and their supporters.

In particular, candidates and their supporters may approach potential voters to ask for their vote, but should not engage in the following activities:

- 1. harassing, intimidating or coercing students to vote for or against a particular candidate;
- 2. inducing (including through bribery or threats) a student to vote for or against a particular candidate; or

3. assisting a student with logging in and voting online on an electronic device.

The University is committed to ensuring the fairness and integrity of the election process.

If you have been approached by a candidate or another student who has engaged in any of these behaviors, you are encouraged to report this behavior to the Returning Officer via BigPulse or email to secretariat.elections@sydney.edu.au

With a surge in malicious cyber activity, securing your online presence has never been more important. In recognition of Cyber Security Awareness Month, here are some easy steps you can take to strengthen your online security.

Need to know

- Your <u>Semester 2 exam timetable</u> is now available. Make sure you carefully check the type
 of exam you're sitting and where it will be taking place. Visit the <u>exams webpage</u> for more
 information on how exams are run and what you need to do to prepare for them. Don't
 forget, you'll need your physical ID card for identification.
- Calculator and dictionary approvals will be available in the Fisher Library Service Hub from 2 September each weekday, 9 am to 5 pm. Ensure your calculator model is eligible for approval via the approvable calculators webpage. CASIO fx-82 models do not need to be approved to be used in exams.

Consent matters

As always, we encourage anyone in need of assistance to access the free and confidential support that is available 24/7 through our Wellbeing team.

We recognise that global events may be distressing for many in our community, including October 7, the ongoing conflict in the Middle East and recent escalations in Lebanon.

The University has already reached out directly to students of Lebanese citizenship or country of residence, to offer support including special consideration, peer support and counselling and extend that offer of support to other affected students.

Respectful behaviour in our community

As a University, we are committed to a community that is built on respect, empathy and inclusivity. We ask you to be mindful of the wellbeing of other students and staff when expressing your views and consider how your behaviour could make others feel.

As a condition of enrolment, all students are reminded to meet the expectations outlined in the <u>Student Charter 2020</u>. We do not tolerate any form of racism, threats to safety, hate speech, intimidation, threatening speech, bullying or unlawful harassment, including antisemitic or anti-Muslim language or behaviour.
