 will be offered fully online. There are a <u>range of support services</u> available to you if you
 need help with your return to campus study.
- Stay up to date with important information about your studies as well as what's happening

 event to share? <u>Send it to us</u> anytime throughout the semester.
- Scams are becoming increasingly prevalent and sophisticated, so it's important you <u>remain</u>
 scam aware and know how to protect yourself. Never reveal any personal information or
 send any money over the phone or online to sources you cannot verify.
- Wether you're thinking of moving out soon or are already renting, it's important you know your rights and responsibilities as a tenant. The <u>SRC's Accommodation Guide</u> is a great resource to have on hand, covering rental scams, contracts and bond and deposits. If you

need advice on understanding, negotiating or ending a contract, <u>contact an SRC</u> caseworker.


