

FACULTY OF MEDICINE AND HEALTH -SYDNEY DENTAL SCHOOL **ATTENDANCE PROVISIONS 2020**

1 **Purpose and application**

- The Sydney Dental School programs involve intensive instruction and students (1) who accept a place in the program do so with this knowledge.
- Satisfactory attendance is a requirement for progression. (2)
- These provisions apply to all students enrolled in Sydney Dental School programs. (3)

Definitions 2

Principles 3

- Students must attend and engage with course content in all clinical, laboratory and (1) simulated clinical settings to develop clinical and professional skills and behaviour.
- (2) Students must satisfy all attendance requirements to meet the progression requirements. Student's must:
 - attend all required learning activities that are core interactive sessions. (a) Students cannot achieve satisfactory attendance by reviewing a recording;
 - be present for the specific class at the scheduled time; (b)
 - arrive on time and stay until the completion of the session; (c)



- (d) attend all sessions where guest speakers are invited to present; and
- (e) meet their learning and progression goals.

Note: See part 15 of the Coursework Policy 2014

- (3) The Director of the SDS will certify that students have met all the requirements of the program.
- (4) The SDS will support students who are unable to meet the satisfactory attendance requirements. Such students may be:
 - (a) at risk of academic failure; or
 - (b) suffering with health or personal issues.
 - **Note**: See subclause 4(3) for information about special consideration or special arrangements.
- (5) Students who are absent are still required to meet all academic requirements of the course.

4 Attendance requirements

- (1) Students must attend at least 90% of all required learning activities.
 - (a) The 90% attendance requirement applies to all students, whether absences are planned or unplanned.
- (2) Students who are absent from more than 10% of the required learning activities of any unit of study:
 - (a) will fail to make satisfactory progress; and
 - Note: See part 15 of the Coursework Policy 2014.
 - (b) will be awarded a fail grade for the unit of study.
 - **Note:** See <u>Faculty of Medicine and Health Sydney Dental School Assessment</u> <u>Provisions 2017</u>.
- (3) If special consideration or special arrangements are sought, the student must make the necessary application in accordance with the <u>Coursework Policy 2014</u>.
 - (a) Student Administration Services will process <u>each application</u> in accordance with the <u>Coursework Policy 2014</u> and the <u>Assessment Procedures 2011</u>.
 - **Note:** See the <u>Special consideration and arrangements website</u>.

5 Notification of absences

- (1) Students must notify staff of absences as soon as possible, and preferably well in advance.
- (2) A student who is unable to attend any rostered clinical session for any reason must, on or before the date of absence:
 - (a) contact the School Education Support Officer;
 - (b) notify the clinic; and
 - (c) follow any placement site requirements.



- (3) A student who is absent from a required learning activity for a period of three consecutive days, or days in close succession, must:
 - (a) notify the School Education Support Officer as soon as practicable and no later than five working days after the last date of the absence; and
 - (b) arrange to meet with the coordinator to discuss the absence.

Note: See the <u>Coursework Policy 2014</u> and <u>Assessment Procedures 2011</u>.

- (4) All absences will be counted towards a student's 90% attendance requirement.Note: See clause 4.
- (5) Students who fail to attend a required learning activity will be recorded as absent.
- (6) At its discretion, the SDS may provide catch-up activities for students who are absent.
 - (a) If a student attends catch-up activities, the record of the original absence will still be retained.
- (7) Students who fail to notify their absence according to these provisions will constitute a breach of the <u>Faculty of Medicine and Health Professionalism</u> <u>Requirements Provisions 2019</u> and will be dealt with under the <u>Faculty of Medicine</u> <u>and Health - Professionalism Provisions 2019</u>.
